



Ground Rules for the Kibbutz Gezer Baseball Field for the Young Cadet, Cadet and Premier League

(a) If a portable fence is erected at a distance of 250 feet from home plate, a batter who hits a ball over the portable fence in flight, but not over the permanent fence, will be awarded a home run in Young Cadet and Cadet League play.

(b) If a portable fence is erected at a distance of 250 feet from home plate, a batter who hits a ball over the portable fence in flight, but not over the permanent fence, will be awarded two bases in Premier League play. Runners in Premier League play will be awarded two bases under the Official Baseball Rules, Rule 7.05(f). However, should the batted ball continue in flight and go over the permanent fence, it will be a home run. The batter will be awarded two bases and runners will be awarded two bases under the Official Baseball Rules, Rule 7.05 (f), if the batted ball goes over the portable fence in flight over fair territory, but afterwards lands in foul territory or continues over the permanent fence in foul territory.

(c) The bases and the pitcher's plate are to be placed at the distances specified in Rule 1.04 and Rule 1.07 for Premier League play, IAB Rule 13.01.04 (a) and IAB Rule 13.01.07 (a) for Cadet League play, and IAB Rule 13.01.04 (b) and IAB Rule 13.01.07 (b) for Young Cadet League play.

KGGR01.23

The dugouts at Kibbutz Gezer Baseball Field are both on the 3rd base side of the field. Defensive coaches will remain in their dugout unless they request time and it is granted by the umpire. (This rescinds the Young Cadet and Cadet League privilege for a defensive coach to be on the field next to the dugout.) The on-deck batter should be aware of the danger of being hit by a foul ball.

KGGR5.10

All areas surrounding the playing field at Kibbutz Gezer are considered "spectator areas" under Rule 5.10 (f) and Rule 7.04 (c). Consequently, if a fielder catches and then carries a batted or thrown ball into this dead ball area including an area outside a gate that has been left open, the ball will be dead and all runners will advance one base. However, if a fielder after catching a fly ball carries the ball into the dugout, it will be live, unless he falls down.

KGGR07.05

(a) The field has gates in the permanent fence. There may also be one or more holes in the permanent fence. Should a batted ball roll under a gate or through a hole in the permanent fence and out of play, the fielder may raise his hands to signal to the umpire that the ball has gone out of play. The umpire, upon confirming that the ball has gone out of play will call the ball dead and award the batter two bases. Runners will be awarded two bases under the Official Baseball Rules, Rule 7.05(f).

(b) If a thrown ball goes under a gate or through the permanent fence and out of play, the ball will be dead and the umpire will award two bases under the Official Baseball Rules, Rule 7.05 (g).

(c) If a batted ball goes under or through the portable fence, or bound over the portable fence, the fielder may raise his hands to signal to the umpire that the ball has gone out of play. The umpire, upon confirming that the ball has gone out of play will call the ball dead and award the batter two bases. Runners will be awarded two bases under the Official Baseball Rules, Rule 7.05(g).

(d) If a thrown ball goes under, over or through the portable fence and out of play, the ball will be dead and the umpire will award two bases under the Official Baseball Rules, Rule 7.05 (g).

(e) There is a light pole in right-center field which is between the portable fence and the permanent fence. When a portable fence is erected at a distance of 250 feet from home plate, the light pole is not in play. When there is no portable fence and the light pole is in the playing field, if a batted ball hits the light pole on a fly, the ball will be called dead, the batter will be awarded two bases, and all runners will be awarded two bases under the Official Baseball Rules, Rule 7.05 (f). The ball will remain live and in play should a ball bound into the light pole.
